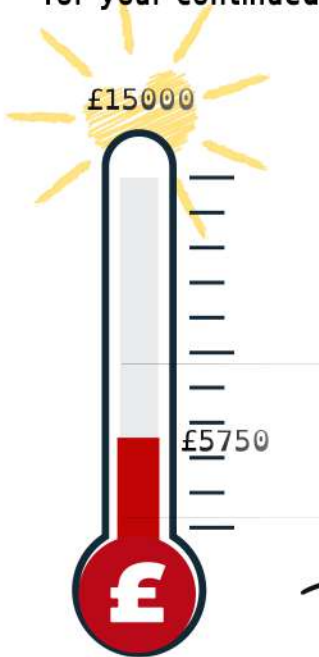

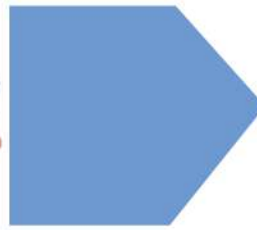
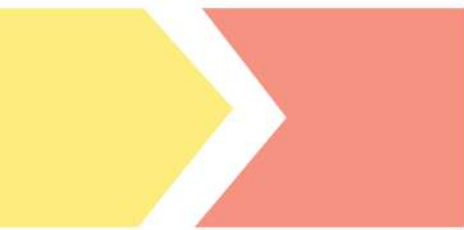
Class 3 – Year 3 & Year 4

Lights Camel ACTION



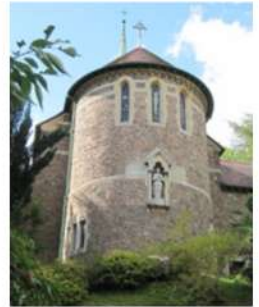
Our Malvern Wells **Christmas production**, Lights, Camel, Action!, will take place on Wednesday 17th December at All Saints Church.
