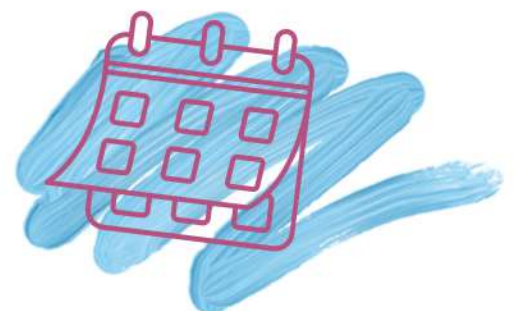

Class 2

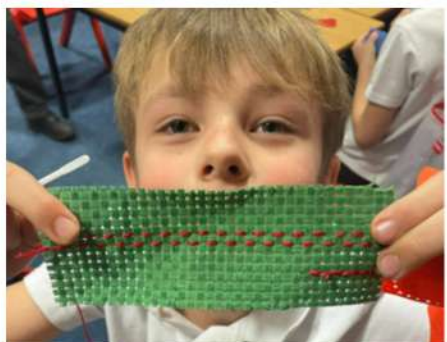

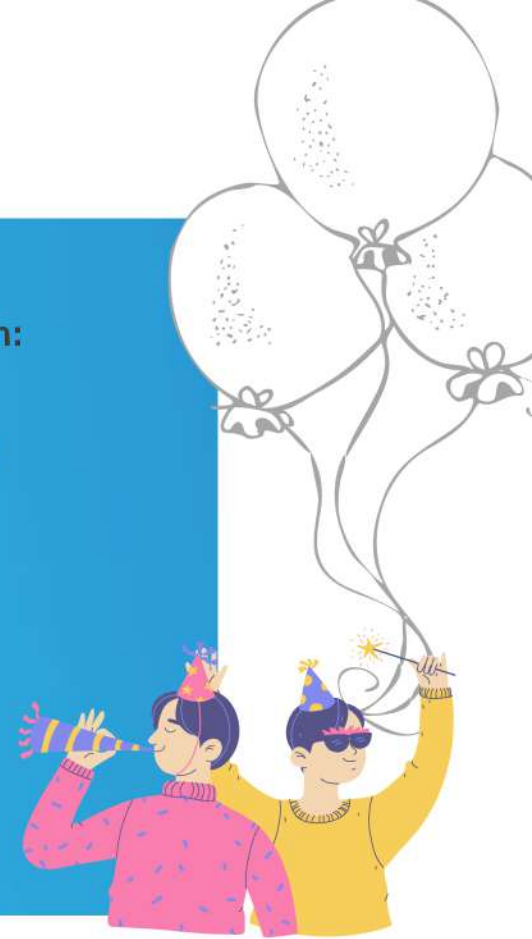
