Knitting Clubs

The children had a wonderful time at the first session last Friday, learning the basics of knitting and enjoying trying out a new creative skill. We are very grateful for Andrada giving her time to run the club and look forward to many more cosy and creative sessions ahead!



CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS:

Class 1:

We have been learning about the life cycle of a bean and how plants grow. The children planted their own beans and are checking and watering them daily while we wait for the first sprouts to appear. Alongside this, we have been busy building castles inside and outside the classroom, and the children have designed their own castles which we will soon begin constructing. We are excited to see both our beans sprout and our castles come to life!

Class 2:

We had a fantastic trip to the Worcester Infirmary Museum, where we explored what life was like for nurses and doctors in the past. The visit linked to their history topic on Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell, helping them understand how healthcare has changed over time. Pupils took part in practical activities around the museum and also visited The Hive, where they enjoyed listening to a story together.

Class 3:

This week the children enjoyed exploring monochromatic colours and 3D drawing in Art, using a horizon line and vanishing point to create depth in their pictures. In Maths, we practised multipliers and had fun measuring and comparing our heights, using maths in a real-life way. It has been a great week of creativity and hands-on learning!

Class 4:

Class 4 have been busy completing their DT projects by building models with working electric circuits. Using their knowledge of simple circuits, pupils designed and created imaginative castles and spooky ghost houses that light up. There was plenty of black paint, glitter, and creativity involved as they brought their ideas to life while learning how electrical components work together.

Parking
