# A LOOK AT THIS WEEK

## Class 1:

This week, Class 1 became young engineers as they designed and built their own cars from cardboard. As part of our topic on transport through the ages, the children explored how vehicles have changed over time and used their creativity, problem-solving, and construction skills to bring their ideas to life. We were so impressed by their imagination and teamwork!



## Class 2:

Class 2 launched their new Textiles module this week and got off to a fantastic start by designing beautiful bookmarks using recycled fabrics. The children carefully selected materials, thought about colour and texture, and created unique designs while learning about sustainability and the importance of reusing resources.



## Class 3:

Class 3 enjoyed a wonderful Forest School session at St Wulstan's Church, where they took part in a Worcester Wildlife Survey. The children learned about local birds, identified different types of lichen, and explored the rich wildlife living around us. Back in the classroom, they developed their mathematical understanding by investigating units of weight, comparing and measuring using kilograms, grams, and milligrams.



## Class 4:

Class 4 have had an unforgettable week on their residential visit to Arete. Throughout the trip, the children challenged themselves with new experiences, built confidence and resilience, and created lasting memories with their friends. We are incredibly proud of the way they embraced every opportunity and represented the school so positively.
