Weekly note from Mrs Alford,

It has been another wonderful week in school, and I continue to feel incredibly proud of our children. Our new Reception children have settled beautifully. It has been a joy to see them playing creatively, growing in confidence and already participating so fully in the Malvern Wells family. I have particularly loved hearing the Reception band performing from their very own 'stage'. There has certainly been no shortage of creativity, confidence or enthusiasm! These are the moments that tell us children are beginning to feel safe, happy and that they truly belong.

Across the school, children have been practising and embedding our routines and transitions so that our days feel calm, purposeful and ready for learning. I have been particularly impressed by the way children are moving around school and transitioning between lessons. These seemingly small habits make such a difference to the learning environment we create together.

We have also really enjoyed welcoming parents into school for our curriculum meetings this week. I hope these have been useful in providing clarity about what your children will be learning, what they can expect from their year ahead and how we can work together to support them.

I also want to gently raise something which is important to me. We know that parent WhatsApp groups can be incredibly useful spaces for families to connect and support one another. At times, however, frustrations or concerns can quickly escalate within these groups before school has had the opportunity to understand or respond to them. This can unintentionally create a sense of division between home and school, which is the very opposite of the partnership we are so keen to develop.

Please never feel that you cannot raise a concern with us. We want open, honest and respectful communication, even when something has not gone well. Our new systems and processes are designed to make it clearer and easier to reach the right person and get the right support. Where something is worrying or frustrating you, I would simply ask that you give us the opportunity to listen, understand and work with you directly. Our values of Community, Commitment, Compassion and Courage matter just as much in the difficult moments as they do in the easy ones. We all want the same thing: for every child at Malvern Wells to achieve, belong and thrive, and we will always accomplish more for our children when school and families work together.

Thank you, as always, for being such an important part of our Malvern Wells family.
