Weekly note from Mrs Alford,

It has been another really lovely and settled week at Malvern Wells. We are beginning to see the real impact of the time spent embedding clear routines and rhythms across the school. The children are moving calmly and confidently through their days, and there is a wonderful sense of purpose throughout school.

I do want to apologise for the recent disarray in our communication. We are very aware that some emails, newsletters and letters home have included conflicting dates or information. This has been confusing and is simply not helpful for you as families. We have discussed how we must improve our systems so that communication is clear, accurate and timely. To give absolute clarity, the Boundless Information Evening for Class 3 is on 29th September.

We have some really **good** news regarding WRAP Around Care. From Monday, Mr Elliott has offered to join Mrs Adams daily at afterschool club to enable us to increase our current capacity from 10 to 18. Breakfast Club capacity will also increase to 15 children.

You may also have noticed that we have been quite firm about children running around at the front of school at the end of the day. We absolutely understand that children want time to socialise and play. However, we are genuinely concerned about their safety so close to a very busy road and around the uneven walls and concrete areas of the outside walkway.

Please could families who are not waiting for siblings move on as quickly as possible, and could all parents work with us to ensure children remain safe while leaving the site. I am sorry if I sometimes appear to be the "Fun Police", but the possibility of a child being hurt really concerns me. It is also quite challenging to dismiss a full class when the inside area is very crowded as it limits visibility.

Finally, we are overwhelmingly grateful to the many parents who are willing to support our school trips. Your generosity makes these valuable experiences possible and is such a wonderful expression of our value of community.

Please could we ask you to wait until the school approaches you about supporting a specific trip. We are sometimes limited by the number of seats available on the coach, and informal conversations can understandably lead to confusion about who is able to attend. We will contact parents directly once we know exactly how many volunteers are needed. Thank you for your understanding and continued support.

A quick reminder that morning break snacks should be healthy. Please do not send children to school with crisps or chocolate bars for their morning snack.

Most importantly, our school must remain completely nut free. We have children with severe allergies, so children must not bring any food containing nuts onto the school site. Please check labels carefully. Thank you for helping us to keep every child safe.

Highlight of the Week

Class 1

A wonderful afternoon of autumn discovery! At Forest School, the children slowed down and noticed the seasonal changes happening all around them. They explored their outdoor environment while learning how to use and care for natural materials. Class 2

Our storytelling came to life this week! The children have been working on an exciting new story map to help them learn and retell our new story, Kassim & The Greedy Dragon. They enjoyed bringing the characters and events to life while developing their understanding of story structure, sequencing and key vocabulary. It has been lovely to see their enthusiasm grow as they become more confident storytellers.

Class 3

History detectives were hard at work! This week, the children stepped into the role of archaeologists, exploring what it might be like to discover and investigate clues from the past. Through their activities, they developed their curiosity and thinking skills while learning more about how archaeologists help us understand history. A hands-on and exciting way to bring the past to life!

Class 4

Creativity took centre stage this week! The children have been designing and making their own clay sculptures, turning their ideas into three-dimensional creations. They explored how to shape and manipulate clay while thinking carefully about their designs. It has been fantastic to see their imaginations come through in their sculptures and watch their ideas develop from the initial design into something they could proudly create themselves.
