Parking in the bus turning and on any yellow zigzag lines



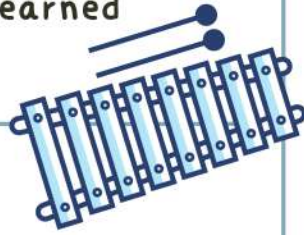
CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS
